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## Chicago Expands Mandatory Affordable Housing for Private Residential Development

Chicago is in the forefront of cities recognizing the critical shortage in affordable housing for their residents and is taking bold actions to address the problem. In 2004, the Chicago Rehab Network estimated a shortage of 49,000 affordable rental units in Chicago, reporting that almost 200,000 Chicago households were "rent burdened." This status is reached when a household pays over 35% of its income for housing. According to the CRN report, 116,000 Chicago households pay over 50% of their total income toward housing expenses and often forgo other necessities. With the elimination of many of the Chicago Housing Authority's high-rises and mid-rises, an



estimated 6,500 families are, or will be, permanently or temporarily displaced.
